AS and A-level Drama and Theatre

AS Year 12 and A-level Year 12 (first year)




AS and A-level students can be taught together.

Students can:

- develop and refine their theatrical skills, including performing, designing, directing
- study and practically explore a play from List A, perhaps using aspects as devising stimuli to introduce students to the devising process
- study and practically explore drama and theatre practitioners
 (A-level students will need to apply two to their own work, AS students only one)
- workshop extracts from different plays (A-level students will need to workshop three, AS students only two)
- experience live theatre.

At the end of Year 12 students can:

- continue straight to A-level with no exam
- sit AS exams and finish with an AS qualification
- sit AS exams then decide whether to continue to A-level or not.



A-level Year 13 (second year)



Students can:

- focus on devising
- study and practically explore a play from List B
- revisit content and skills covered in the first year
